Rhode Island Climate Resilience Program

1. Planning

- **Resilient Rhody** Rhode Island Resilience 2024 Report Winter 2024; Resilient Rhody 2.0 Strategy to follow in 2025 in accordance with Act on Coasts
- Community Resilience Building Workshops 2.0 (MRP + HMP) FEMA BRIC application submitted Feb 2024
- Annual Resilience Updates & Grant Application Assistance Meetings For 2024, held with cities & towns weeks of May 13th and May 20th; for municipalities who missed this window, a second window will be offered after the 4th holiday

2. Implementation

- Resilience Design & Engineering Assistance Decisions for Round 1 to be announced week of June 24th
- State + Federal Resilience Grants OSCAR applications received; MRP Action Grant and Climate Resilience Fund RFPs active; NOAA CRRC application submitted Feb 2024; NFWF NCRF Letter of Intent submitted April 2024 and approved


Capacity Building & Partnerships

- State Resilience Office (Regional Resilience Coordinators) Five (5) regional coordinators proposed; NOAA CRRC application submitted Feb 2024; Anticipated to hear Summer 2024
- **EC4 Resilience Collaboration –** Resilience EC4 Subgroup designees determined for each agency and group to meet July 12th
- Rhode Island Resilience Partners Non-profit and university partners positioned to provide community engagement, workforce development, and knowledge transfer activities under NOAA CRRC application submitted Feb 2024; Resilience Partners meetings anticipated to begin Summer 2024

4. Transparency & Information Sharing

- Resilience Web Resources Website additions for Statewide Resilience Resources, Grant Opportunities & Events, and searchable Resilience Action Database scoped
- Annual Rhode Island Resilience Summit Event anticipated Jan 2025 in alignment with launch of MRP Community Resilience Building Workshops 2.0

MRP Action Grants & Climate Resilience Fund

1. Municipal Resilience Program Action Grants

- Eligible Projects: Design & Construction projects that deliver climate resilience benefit (Removal/Redesign/Relocation of vulnerable infrastructure, Green Infrastructure & Nature-Based Solutions)
- Funds Available: \$19.4mm awarded to date | \$5mm available (due July 26th) | \$10mm anticipated through 2024 State Green Bond | 25% Match Required

2. Climate Resilience Fund Grants

- Eligible Projects: Design & Construction projects that deliver climate resilience benefit (Removal/Redesign/Relocation of vulnerable infrastructure, Green Infrastructure & Nature-Based Solutions); some Planning costs considered
- Funds Available: \$4.3mm awarded to date | \$1mm available (due July 26th application matches MRP) |
 \$2mm anticipated through 2024 State Green Bond | 25% Match Required

3. Key Updates from Previous Rounds

- Application Process Applications for the two programs have been aligned; an MRP application can also be considered for CRF funding
- **Requirement –** Designation of the specific climate scenario or projection your project will address (design storm, sea level rise scenario, etc.), and demonstration of improvement from existing vulnerability
- Requirement Current design life of structures to be adapted in place
- Review Criteria Nature Based Solutions & Long-Term (Relocation) approaches to be co-prioritized

Federal Resilience Funding

1. NOAA Climate Resilience Regional Challenge (CRRC)

- RIDEM submitted a proposal for \$55m for activities including landmark resilience projects; community
 engagement, workforce development, and knowledge transfer; resilience funding programs (grants);
 and regional resilience coordinators.
 - The proposed work addresses four key categories of resilience Land Protection and Relocation; Resilience Hubs; Nature-Based Adaptation; and Shoreline Public Access
 - Activities to be provided across 39 Collaborators and 11 Subawardees
 - Expected to hear Summer 2024

2. NFWF National Coastal Resilience Fund (NCRF)

- RIDEM is submitting a proposal for \$10 million in essential, locally-prioritized, and ready-to-proceed municipal climate resilience projects statewide, spanning 10 municipalities.
 - The proposed projects were awarded design funding through Municipal Resilience Program Action Grants and/or have completed design. The award would support restoration implementation / construction.
 - Projects address flooding & erosion concerns in our coastal and riverine systems through Marsh/Wetland Restoration, Dune Restoration, Green Infrastructure, and Aquatic Connectivity.
