



Statewide Coastal Resilience Plan 2025


R.I. Gen. Laws § 46-23.4-1 - Act on Coasts

Setting new goals, surveying our vulnerabilities, and determining our best practices for future investment.

Proposed Components:

- Gap Analysis & 2025 State Resilience Goals (Revised from Resilient Rhody 2018)
- Assessment of Statewide Climate Change Vulnerabilities
 - Utilization of federal & state resilience data to assess vulnerability of each of the infrastructural, economic, environmental, and societal asset types considered in Resilient Rhody 2018 (which encompasses and expands upon those named in Act on Coasts)
 - Climate impacts determined in Resilient Rhody will be considered (sea level rise, storm surge, intense precipitation, warming air & water temps, & changing biodiversity)
 - For each asset type, the analysis will consider short, medium, and long term scenarios (2035, 2050, and 2100).
- RI Climate Resilience Best Practices
- Review of Funding/Financing Options & National Resources
- Municipal Resilience Priority Actions

Statewide Resilience Collaboration



State Resilience Funding

Municipal Resilience Program Action Grants & Climate Resilience Fund Grants

- Eligible Projects:
 Removal/Redesign/Relocation of vulnerable infrastructure, Green Infrastructure & Nature-Based Solutions
- MRP Funds Available: \$10mm approved through 2024 State Green Bond
- CRF Fund Available: \$2mm approved through 2024 State Green Bond
- 25% match required



Upcoming Updates

NFWF National Coastal Resilience Fund

In June, RIDEM a proposal for \$10 million in essential, locally-prioritized, and ready-to-proceed municipal climate resilience projects statewide, spanning 10 municipalities.

- The proposed projects were awarded design funding through Municipal Resilience Program
 Action Grants and/or have completed design. The award would support restoration
 implementation / construction.
- Projects address flooding & erosion concerns in our coastal and riverine systems through Marsh/Wetland Restoration, Dune Restoration, Green Infrastructure, and Aquatic Connectivity.
- Anticipated to hear November 2024

Regional Resilience Coordinators

Early 2025 (Jan/Feb), RIDEM will be hiring on **3 Regional Resilience Coordinators** to support local municipalities on climate resilience grants and project management.

- DEM will be hiring a coastal, an urban, and an inland position.
- Aquidneck Island will receive coordination support through Aquidneck Land Trust.
- Municipalities will be engaged in the decision-making process through open house Q&As with finalist candidates.
