

#### 2020 Forest Action Plan

- 2. Provides goals, policies, and strategies focused on the management of tree resources.
- 3. Intended to advance local stewardship towards the twin goals of a healthy, sustainable forest economy and forest environment.

- **Annual Appropriations**
- . \$300,000
- \$100k Increase for FY23 +
- Salary and Fringe for 1 FTE (Lou)
- \$55,000 RI Tree Council subaward
- \$150,000 Pass Through Grants
  - (Historically \$60,000)







- BIL Funding
- \$126,000/yr increase to base funding
- Salary and Fringe for 1 additional FTE
  - Volunteer Coordinator (requirement)
  - Contract employee (TNC)
  - Early 2024 Start date





### IRA Funding

- \$1.2 million
  - (5 year spend down)

#### URBAN AND COMMUNITY FORESTRY GRANTS

The USDA Forest Service's Urban and Community Forestry Program awarded more than \$1 billion to fund projects that support urban communities through equitable access to trees and the benefits they provide. The funding was made possible by the Inflation Reduction Act.

## IRA Funding

- Provides technical assistance for up to 8 municipalities/tribes
- Kick-start new urban forestry programs or enhance existing
  - Planning AND Planting
- Support for 2-3 years
- Staggered start times (winter '24, summer '24, sinter '25)
- Partnership with Green Infrastructure Center (2 additional FTEs)





### IRA Funding

Evaluation Criteria

Climate and Environmental Justice Screening Tool (CJEST)

Points based on disadvantaged population percentage (scaled)

Tree Equity Score

Points based on Score (scaled)

Additional points for applicants who represent a locality containing a Health Equity Zone.



## FY23 Congressionally Directed Spending



\$300,000 to be used to leverage IRA Funds

Will allow for spending outside of the IRA constraints

## Urban Forestry Program

- State Urban Forest Resilience Grant (SUFR)
- \$100,000 competitive grant
  - Partnership with PNPP and NTC
  - Utilized Tree Equity Score Analyzer to plan and implement tree planting in low score neighborhoods
  - Produced an Impact Certification for the projects
  - Published outcomes on the use of the TESA



## EC4 Funding

- **\$120,000** 
  - Will be made available to improve urban sites for planting
  - Asphalt removal, soil replacement, etc.
  - Will help increase tree canopy in heavily hardscaped areas to provide better survivability.
