Priority Assets List Summary

Prioritization Approach Qualification

Interpreting and Understanding the Limits of Prioritization

The Prioritization Approach used in this Plan is intended to provide a practical and actionable structure for advancing resilience at the State level. Inclusion or relative ranking of specific assets should not be interpreted as an indication that assets not identified are of lesser importance or value. Rather, the framework supports decision-making and phased implementation within the context of this Plan.

Prioritization within complex, interdependent systems is inherently challenging. There is no single definitive method for ranking assets, as infrastructure, communities, and ecological systems function as an interconnected network. Disruptions in one sector or geography can produce cascading effects across others. No asset operates in isolation, and any prioritization approach necessarily simplifies the dynamic relationships that influence statewide resilience.

This complexity is most evident in the State's natural systems, which underpin the State's built, community, and cultural infrastructure. Degradation of natural systems can result in widespread and systemic impacts, while healthy ecosystems provide essential buffering functions that reduce hazard risks. **Accordingly, this Plan affirms that protecting, managing, and restoring natural systems is not ancillary to resilience efforts but central to them.** Continued investment in assessing, conserving, and restoring these systems is essential to long-term statewide resilience, including benefits not fully reflected in this asset-based prioritization approach but captured within this Plan's Actions and recommended Solutions.

To support effective action within this context, the assets considered through this effort can be considered within a tiered prioritization structure. This approach enables near-term decision-making while maintaining a comprehensive understanding of the broader natural and built systems that form the foundation of resilience.

- **Shortlist of Priority Assets**
Assets identified for immediate evaluation and action through the prioritization process described herein.
- **Additional Priority Assets (Including Initiative Alignment and Regional Technical Assistance Packages Assets)**
Assets identified by State communities that are ongoing or positioned to advance to subsequent phases. Additional outreach and analysis should confirm vulnerabilities and support progression into planning and design, as appropriate.
- **All Vulnerable Assets**
The full set of assets evaluated through the Vulnerability Assessment. These assets should continue to undergo analysis and stakeholder engagement to validate and refine risk understanding over time.

Priority Assets List Development

Feedback Process

The Priority Assets List is the result of a comprehensive vulnerability assessment, prioritization process, and integration of statewide feedback. The Prioritization Approach utilized was developed specifically for the scope of this Plan. The Priority Assets List reflected herein does not include all vulnerable assets, nor does it reflect broader prioritization initiatives. A comprehensive database of all at-risk assets evaluated through this process has been provided to the State to support future work and enable continued prioritization efforts beyond the scope of this initiative.

Review Process

The Priority Assets List was created through input gathered from multiple engagement streams, including community forums and municipal stakeholder working sessions. Platforms for feedback included virtual and in-person meetings, email, Miro, and Mentimeter. After each meeting outlined to the right, participants were given time to review and provide feedback on the list. The official review period ran from Friday, October 3 through Friday, October 24. Regional Resilience Coordinators contacted municipalities within their networks to solicit feedback. Stakeholders provided input via email and follow-up calls. The list reflected herein represents an additive approach: new assets were added as they were identified, and assets were only removed upon direct request from stakeholders actively engaged with them.

Some assets were determined to be more local in scale. These are included in a separate list titled “**Additional Priority Assets**” and should be targeted for future local climate adaptation and resilience planning efforts. While certain solutions outlined in this Plan may apply to these sites, dedicated solutions were not developed as part of this Plan.

Regional Technical Assistance Packages

Regional Resilience Coordinators

Overview

In June of 2025, Rhode Island Department of Environmental Management hired three Regional Resilience Coordinators to support the Chief Resilience Officer and local resilience efforts statewide as part of the agency's growing resilience team. These coordinators, covering three distinct regions (Coastal, Inland, and Urban), provide technical assistance to municipalities and communities for advancing their resilience priorities. Assistance areas delivered include community engagement & outreach; municipal resilience planning & project identification; background research & case studies; grant writing & proposal development; project management; communications on funding & assistance opportunities; and data analysis & mapping.

To define local resilience needs and establish workplans, coordinators held introductory meetings with municipalities in their regions to establish Resilience Technical Assistance Packages (RTAPs) with cities and towns. Building upon findings of local Municipal Resilience Program (MRP) Summary of Findings reports, Hazard Mitigation Plans (HMPs), and Comprehensive Plans, these RTAPs identify each municipality's top three resilience priorities for 2026, which span from needed flood and heat reduction solutions on-the-ground to local resilience ordinance development, planning, and funding mechanism needs. The RTAPs then identify coordinator assistance areas that can help to advance these efforts, establishing how the coordinator will support the municipality over the course of the next year.

Statewide Partnerships & Collaboration

In addition to the RTAP process, Regional Resilience Coordinators provide ongoing technical assistance for the state's Municipal Resilience Program (MRP) through completing annual update meetings to review municipalities' MRP identified resilience actions, to establish local resilience work completed to date and projects in need of support. Coordinators also support municipal application development for MRP Action Grants. In partnership with Department of Health and the Executive Office of Health & Human Services, in the coming year Regional Resilience Coordinators will be also be broadening their support to Health Equity Zone (HEZ) Collaboratives. Beyond these inter-agency collaborations, coordinators partner with numerous local and regional organizations and workgroups to advance resilience priorities across the state.

Regional Technical Assistance Packages (RTAPs) & Resilient Rhody 2025

To support the *Resilient Rhody 2025* priority asset identification process, coordinators compiled all 2026 priority resilience actions named by municipalities in their RTAPs for inclusion within this report. While RTAP assets listed do not necessarily reflect highest risk assets as named in the state's vulnerability assessment, they do reflect projects with strong municipal buy in, existing project development (vulnerability assessments and/or designs in progress), and ability to move forward within the next calendar year. This list of RTAP actions serves as supplemental list of local short-term resilience priorities to further inform the state's *Resilient Rhody* actions and Priority Asset List.
